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Re: Billing Codes for Electrodiagnostic Neurometer® CPT® Evaluations

Dear Health Care Provider,

Thank you for your request regarding the billing codes for the electrodiagnostic Neurometer® CPT® automated sensory Nerve Conduction Threshold (sNCT®) evaluation. The sNCT® evaluation generates neuroselective Current Perception Threshold (CPT®) values that quantify the functional integrity sensory nerve fibers. At present, the sNCT®/CPT® exam does not have its own specific billing code. The Neurometer® CPT® evaluation device received FDA permission to market in 1986. Since this time for general billing purposes often a "best fit" approach is employed by physicians. This is a standard procedure when no specific code is available, physicians have been instructed to use the closest appropriate billing code or the unlisted procedure code in the most appropriate section of the Physicians' Current Procedural Terminology (CPT 2010, Professional Edition, American Medical Association, Chicago, IL, 2000.). For self pay patients, the recommended description is sNCT® CPT® evaluation and it is billed per nerve tested.

Presently, there are a number of different billing codes used for third party insurance purposes in the U.S. This includes #95904, which applies to "Nerve conduction: sensory or mixed" evaluation and is billed on a per nerve basis. The use of this code is recommend based on policies determined in response to inquiries to various local insurance entities throughout the country, legal rulings and Workers' Compensation Commission Guidelines. Another billing code used is #95925, which is listed as "Short-latency somato-sensory evoked potential study" and is generally used for the evaluation of spinal cord and CNS sensory impairments. The billing code #95999 may also be used, which covers an "Unlisted neurological" diagnostic procedure". The HCPCS code for the Neurometer® CPT® evaluation is G0255 and presently the current perception threshold evaluation is not reimbursed by Medicare ([www.cms.gov](http://www.cms.gov)). Other third-party payers may reimburse this HCPCS code.

Since the assignment of specific test codes and their coverage varies widely from one location to another as well as between different insurance entities in the same location, it is always wise to check with your particular carrier to determine what is correct for your practice.

Generally, with first time claims with a specific carrier, an explanation is enclosed stating that the code #95904 is being submitted for the electrodiagnostic sensory nerve conduction threshold evaluation. A copy of the graded Neuval® CPT Examination report with physician's comments may or may not be included. Actual amounts of reimbursement can vary widely according to location and carrier.
